Greetings to my church family! I hope you all had a blessed Easter!

With great joy and thankfulness to the Lord our God, I share with you that approximately \$2,000 was distributed to various organizations from the Sustaining Gift Trust Fund. The following organizations received a distribution: CHOSEN Mission Project, CAPNWP (camping), Women's Care Center, Presbyterian Homes Caring for Life, Common Ground, and SIM Kirschner Mission.

Your Session is beginning to discuss how to finance large-ticket building projects. Currently, the break wall south of the church is in need of repair. Also, the brickwork on the main church building needs attention. Did you know these bricks are from the year 1880? It's also a softer style of brick than what was used decades later for the Christian Education wing. We are investigating grants and considering a capital campaign. Currently, these projects are estimated at \$90,000 total.

Christian Education will be starting a new group for parents with young children. Also, a new class will be offered soon on the Islamic faith.

Some dates you will want to keep in mind are April 17, which is Blanket Sunday, June 18 for a Seawolves game at 7:00 P.M., and hold August 6 or 7 for a Fellowship picnic at Freeport beach.

## PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN! LET'S CELEBRATE OUR BIRTHDAYS!

April is your special birthday month! Yes, it all began in 1922 when Presbyterian Women were asked to celebrate the years of their lives by giving a penny for each year of their life to help an orphanage in Japan. The birthday offering, given by Presbyterian Women of Faith, began a tradition of meeting the needs of God's children through acts of mission.

Today, we are joining Presbyterian Women throughout our country to raise \$500,000 for the 2016 mission recipients. The selected programs include: *Heartland 180* in Overland, Kansas, which serves boys and girls between the ages of 11 and 17 who have been part of the criminal justice system; *Habitat for Humanity East Bay/Silicon Valley* who will partner with 100 individuals and families to repair the manufactured homes of low income families—many who are elderly or disabled;

*Direct Action and Research Training Center (DART)* who will train clergy and lay leaders to build powerful local justice ministries; and *Building Minds in South Sudan*, which invests in girls' education by funding the construction of a girls' primary school for grades one through eight in South Sudan. The school will serve some 600 girls.

In April, we will celebrate our birthdays at our Spring Gathering. (See article above.) At this time, we will receive our "birthday offering," welcome a speaker, and disburse funds.

How much is each year on earth worth to those for whom you care each day? Ask them to join in your birthday contribution so that we can give generously to meeting the needs of these worthy 2016 mission recipients!


