## THE PASTOR'S PEN



One of the true gems located within the halls of our church is the Gertrude M. Bostwick Memorial Library. The Bostwick library is lovingly cared for, ordered, and promoted by the Library Committee. Because of their diligent and thoughtful efforts, our library has proved to be a source of knowledge, inspiration, and joy for countless members through the years.

February is Library Month here at the church. I would like to encourage you to make your way to the library and check out at least one book to read. Perhaps you would consider taking time to read each day during the upcoming Lenten Season. There are many, many fine volumes from which to choose. Here are a few selections that I offer for your consideration:

First, there is Anne Lamott's *Plan B: Further Thoughts on Faith*. Lamott is both a nationally known novelist and a Presbyterian Elder! Plan B is a marvelous collection of stories from her own life. She writes in a vulnerable and endearing way but refuses to romanticize her life and faith. It's easy to find yourself in the stories that she tells.

Second, pick up Eric Metaxas' *Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy*. Metaxas has published works in a variety of literary genres. This biography of Dietrich Bonhoeffer has rightly earned him great praise. He was even asked to speak at the National Prayer Breakfast a few years ago. The biography is lengthy but also hard to put down. Metaxas has an engaging and enjoyable (if not humorous) way of storytelling.

Third, in *Speaking my Mind*, Christian sociologist, writer, and speaker Tony Campolo raises and attempts to answer a variety of challenging questions that we Christians are asking these days. Campolo's style is very direct and unwavering. You may not always agree with his conclusions but he will certainly make you think deeply.

I wish you a blessed February and beginning to the Lenten Season. It's cold out so stay inside and read a good book!

# CLERKS CORNER



Greetings to my church family!

This is a busy time for Session as we are working with the closing of one year and the beginning of a new one. Your Session met on January 10, 2016 to adopt a new budget. I'm very pleased to let you know that after many years of a projected deficit budget, this year we expect to have a balanced one! This was achieved in a three-fold manner:

1. Your generous giving (first and foremost)
2. A 3% reduction in all controllable expenses
3. A modest staff salary increase estimated around 1% (all staff except the Pastor, as the congregation will vote on that salary package at the annual meeting)

The church staff runs a tight financial ship, but this year will be even tighter.

In other matters, our neighbor, *The Cork*, is expanding. Session took a hard look at their plans to build a section for walk-in cooler units. After we studied it and met with the proprietors, we decided the building project was not a concern. Their project falls upon their property,

and the only variance needed was to the south of their building. The parking spots that will be lost as a result of this project are few, and are not located within the church's property. There will be a follow-up meeting held between Pastor Townsend, Paul Zorzie and the owner of *The Cork* to iron out responsibility for the upkeep of the area between the buildings, although our relationship with *The Cork* is excellent, and they have been very amenable to working with the church.

In case you haven't noticed, the windows above the Assembly Room have been replaced with glass block. The previous windows were not doing the job of keeping the elements outside. This project cost \$12,500 and was paid for out of the church's savings. Session also approved the replacement of a specific section of a rubber roof, as it has been repaired and patched too many times. This will also be paid for out of past generous giving (savings).






## HELP FEED LOCAL FAMILIES
