I sometimes make a "New Year's Resolutions" list but not this year. This year I've decided to keep a list of "New Year's Hopes and Dreams" for our congregation, which I plan to bring before God in prayer throughout the year. I thought I'd share that list with you, and perhaps it will inspire you to pray along with me.

First and foremost, I'm hoping that we will take discipleship more and more seriously. I pray that each of us will follow Jesus in a devoted way and that we will in turn make disciples of others, just as he asked us.

Fourth, I'm hoping that we will have more fun together fellowshipping with one another. Elder Doty Wagner and the Fellowship Committee are planning a calendar of events for 2016. If you have ideas, please share them with her. If you would like to help out in the planning or making special events happen, please let her know. She and her committee can use all the help they can get. All hands on deck!

Fifth, I'm hoping that we will follow Jesus devotedly in our financial stewardship. It has been wonderful to see a slight increase in pledge giving this year but, honestly, we still have a long way to go. The Bible asks for us to set aside 10% of our income as a tithe to the Lord's house. Will you do that this year? Why not take a chance on using your money God's way? It's the safest investment you can make!

In addition, our Kids' Choir, with a solo speaking part by John McClure, sang two beautiful Christmas songs.

The youth once again tackled the project of cookie baking. Several of our youth and their parents spent the first few weeks of December baking, decorating, plating, and selling cookies to the members of our congregation. More than 100 dozen cookies were made and sold. Kudos to the youth for a great job!

Upcoming youth events will include an outing to be decided upon by the youth, the *Souper Bowl of Caring* collection and lunch, a (possible) Otters hockey game, and planning for a Mission trip this summer.

The youth and the Mission Committee are sponsoring a soup and non-perishable food drive to help the food pantry feed members of our community this winter.
