THE PASTOR'S PEN

Although our calendars tell us that the year is slowly approaching the end of the calendar year, it seems that in many ways the "year" is just beginning: Children and teachers are back in school, college football teams are taking the field, and many community programs and entertainment events are promoted. In many ways the grape harvest and the changing colors of the trees signal a time of new beginnings.

The arrival of the fall season also signals a time of new beginnings here at church. Of course, we have never stopped being the church! We bear witness to and faithfully follow Jesus each and every day. The church calendar, however, does tell us that Sunday School classes have begun for children and adults, mission projects like the CROP walk and Operation Christmas boxes are, or are soon to be, underway. I hope that you will come and be a part of the worship and mission life of our church as we touch lives in our town and all over the world in Jesus' name.

Specifically, I'd like to ask you to do three things. First, attend worship! Like almost all Protestant congregations in the United States, a significant portion of our congregation's membership only occasionally or sometimes rarely attends worship services. I'm sure you agree that worshipping and being strengthened by God's word along with other Christians is vital to being a strong Christian. Come on out at 8:30 A.M. or 11:00 A.M. each Sunday and stay for Sunday School in between those services.

Second, be involved! Recently we held a special time following worship in which the different committees of our church set up tables to describe their activities. It was great to see a number of people commit to participating in a variety of ways in the days ahead. God has given you gifts, abilities, and interests to use in His service and for His glory. I hope that you will take advantage of that. If you are interested in serving and aren't sure where to go please talk with me or the chair of our Membership Development Committee, Pauline Fisher. We'd be happy to help you find a way into serving others in such a way that it will be enjoyable and encouraging for you.

Third, invite others to attend with you! I recently read the results of a survey on the factors that contributed most notably to churches that grow in worship attendance, membership, and mission activity. The results were not surprising at all. There were no surprising insights. There was no magic bullet or special factors! There are the three main reasons why congregations grow in worship attendance and membership: 1. Biblical Preaching: people want to attend churches where the Bible is honored and explained clearly, 2. The congregation is a welcoming place, and 3. People were invited to attend church. That's it! It was that simple.

We are doing a great job at 1. and 2.: Biblical preaching is essential to us and our congregation is a welcoming place. Visitors often remark on these two things to me. When we receive new members they often state these two reasons for becoming a part of our congregation. So, it is number 3 that is our challenge and opportunity. I ask you to please invite a friend to attend church with you this week and make a regular practice of doing so.

Happy Fall to my Church Family! I hope this note finds you well.

Here is an update on what we are doing around the Session table.

First, due to a change in the presbytery rules, our church is now eligible to send a second Ruling Elder to the presbytery meetings. As no one elder is able to wholly commit to this schedule, we are developing a rotation based schedule. This additional representative will have voting privileges. Also, this representative need not be an elder currently serving. So, if you are an elder and have an interest in representing our church at these meetings, please speak with Pastor Gregg or with me. There are five meetings in 2017 and the dates are already set.

Our beautiful church building gets older every year, and consequently is in need of some TLC (Tender Loving Care). There is some water damage in the basement, the brickwork needs sealed and the break wall along the creek is crumbling. Session enacted a Subcommittee on Building Needs to get a comprehensive understanding of the scope and expense of pressing needs. The committee is a blend of Trustees and Session. I'll keep you informed as new developments occur.

Session approved me (Patti Kuna) as the new church secretary. I aim to serve you all faithfully and efficiently. Thank you for your patience as I learn the nuts and bolts of this new role.

Kudos to Pauline Fisher and Doty Wagner who, along with their committees, successfully hosted our first "Faith in Action" Sunday on September 18. The goal of this event was to inform and encourage more people to get involved with the life of the church.

The Mission Committee is always very active. The group recently sent \$2500 to the North East Food Pantry for the purchase of fresh eggs. Eggs are an inexpensive source of protein, relative to meat, and easy to prepare. Many, many families frequenting the food pantry will benefit from this nutritious item.

The Mission Committee also reported to Session that over \$1500 was raised through Erie Gives. These funds are earmarked for the 2017 mission trip. Finally, this committee coordinated our church's participation in last month's Erie County Crop Walk held at Presque Isle.

The Christian Education committee is once again hosting Financial Peace University. Jenn McClure is leading the class. There are a number of folks benefitting from this program and from Jenn's leadership.


