

FALL 2016 SUNDAY SCHOOL OPPORTUNITIES

SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES BEGIN ON SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 11 AT 9:45 A.M.

GODLY PLAY: AGE 4 & KINDERGARTEN

Godly Play is a method of Christian education and spiritual direction for preschool and Kindergartenaged children. The goal of *Godly Play* is to teach children to become more fully aware of the mystery of God's presence in their lives. This Montessori approach to education will help your child learn the building blocks of faith through reenacting Bible stories and other play techniques while being open to others, to new ideas, and to the future in creative ways.

GRADES 1 AND 2

Grade 1 & 2 curriculum focuses on learning to read while exploring Bible stories and verses that children are able to understand and recall. Children learn that God wants our trust and obedience, which leads them to Jesus, their Savior. Gospel Light confidently guides the teaching of the Bible—pure and simple, in contemporary and creative ways that will lay God's Word as the foundation for your kids' lives.

GRADES 3, 4, AND 5

Gospel Light's "Give Me Jesus" for Upper Elementary students continues with the format of the 1st and 2nd grade curriculum. The curriculum is designed to use Bible stories and verses that the children understand and in addition, help them to develop meaningful relationships and an understanding of Jesus as our Savior. Students also discover what the Bible says about popularity, success, failure, friendship, rules and more. Kids develop Bible study skills, grow in Christian maturity and respond by serving Jesus in church and the community.

FAITH AND FELLOWSHIP CLASS: YOUTH GRADES 6 THROUGH 12

Sundays at 9:45 am in the Youth Room, taught by in a rotation by Steve Seymour, Tom McClure, and Katie Gallagher; along with Guest Teachers to be determined.

Our new Youth Sunday School class will focus on specific Bible Study along with discovery of what it is like to "Be the Church." Our youth will discover the love of Jesus Christ and realize how God has uniquely created each of them with certain passions, talents, and interests to impact the world for Christ. In addition, many Fellowship opportunities and activities will be interwoven throughout the course of the year both in and outside of class setting.

ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL 2016-2017

SAINTS:

(FOR ANY AND ALL ADULT LEARNERS)

This class is designed for those who are life-long learners in God's word. Join the Saints group as they continue to study the word of God using the Bible; as well as additional resources.

SEEKERS: "OPEN YOUR BIBLE" STUDY (FOR 20 – 40 SOMETHINGS)

The Seekers began last year and has been successfully self-directed by attendees. It is a unique class, which will help participants explore and know God's love and grace. The focus and format of this class is different from any others offered. This class will begin the year with an "Open Your Bible" study session with details to follow as plans are finalized.

FINANCIAL PEACE UNIVERSITY IS COMING SOON.

2015 MISSION TRIP EXPERIENCE



I have begun writing this article numerous times and have written and rewritten. I finally realized that I have done this because I so much wanted our readers to experience the same love of Jesus that I myself, and other members of our team experienced this summer in Philippi, West Virginia. It is difficult to convey because our Mission Experience was such a passionate undertaking and experience. So if you can bear with me, I am going to write in the first person,

from my "heart."

To begin, this is the story of a journey of a Mission Team of various ages and experiences who traveled to Philippi, West Virginia this summer – and MADE A DIFFERENCE. Our team included John Luchs, Krissy Cole-Lane, Terry Andrews, Garrett Connors, Makayla Albney, Krista Banks, Cole Elkin, Patti and Joe Kuna, Evelyn and Vivian Daugherty and myself, as their leader.

I know that many of our team members began this trip a little apprehensive, not really knowing what to expect, and definitely being asked by the Lord, to "step out of their comfort zones." Nevertheless, we were eager and willing to attack, with our team's "laundry list" in hand, of jobs to check-off and complete for our host family, the Crostons, which included Gregg and Bryan and their three children Khia, Jaylynn, and Travis.

After a long day of travel on our first Sunday, we checked in and participated in all of the "mandatory" meeting –stuff before embarking back to our dorms to get ready to begin our adventure. The team was phenomenal throughout the week, from the start of the day on Monday to the end of the week on Friday. We laughed, cried, sighed, were "stretched" to the max physically, but with "strong" spirits worked very, very, very hard. I found myself being more inspired as each day passed by the numerous amazing gifts the Lord bestowed upon us. I kept thinking of the parable of the fishes and the loaves, because in manpower, strength and will-power, that is what he provided us, as we tackled and completed each and every job (AND MORE) in order to make the Croston home a safer and more comfortable place to live.

Some of these physical jobs included the replacement of two doors and windows within the home. {According to Gregg, this will be the first time in three years that they will be able to lock their door when they leave home (as the previous door did not lock). In addition, our team not only removed wallpaper, but repaired several holes and deteriorating plaster, as well as painted the kitchen, living room and two bedrooms for the family.

Though we were provided with the strength to continue and complete the "laundry list" of jobs; that truly was not the focal point of the gifts that were bestowed upon us during our week in Philippi. I personally was able to experience first-hand (as were all of our team members) the love provided through Jesus Christ as we not only developed meaningful friendships with Gregg, Bryan and the children; but some of our members were even able to "witness" to both Gregg and Bryan. In addition, our team members were also able to connect with many members from other teams, developing friendships and bonds with others who also joined the Mission Experience in Philippi that week; and most especially developed strong bonds among our own team. HIS message was conveyed and delivered to us through the selfless acts from friends and families; the stories of other Mission teams and families and through the laughter, tears and connections that developed among our team members. Our 2016 Mission Experience was one of the most unforgettable, impactful experiences I have ever participated in. It truly was memorable and I was so truly blessed by a loving, giving, and perseverant team. Thank-you John, Krissy, Terry, Garrett, Makayla, Krista, Cole, Evelyn, Vivian, Patti, and Joe for helping me see the love and light of our Lord Jesus Christ during a most impactful week!

CROP Hunger Walk funds assist all over the world in ending hunger through programs on food provision and development, clean water, vulnerable children, refugee programs and emergencies. The money we raise helps provide for immediate needs and helps makes sustainable changes for the long haul. For more information on who benefits, see our events page.

Church World Service is working with partners in the U.S. and around the world to build interfaith and intercultural coalitions to eradicate hunger and poverty and promote peace.

The complete walk has been changed to 5 1/2 miles along Presque Isle State Park and is no longer at Stone Jetty but Waterworks near the Rotary Pavilion.

A shorter 1-mile walk is available which goes to the Stull Center and returns on the Bay side.

The Erie walk is the largest Crop Walk in Pennsylvania! Of the money raised, 25% will be given to the local food pantries to help the hungry here in Erie.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will there be a water stop?

Yes, there will be a water stop along the course at Water Works

What is the course?

The Walk is a 5.5-mile circle: up the Lake Side to Waterworks.

What if I have trouble?

There will be Emergency help available for any trouble or assistance.

How does this walk help Erie?

25% of all funds are given as grants to local hunger fighting agencies


