THE PASTOR'S PEN



This month I continue to share with you several "wishes" I have for our congregation for 2017. My hope is that our church will serve our Lord Jesus more and more faithfully by living according to God's instruction.

Last month we considered the importance of attending worship services each Sunday. God commands us to do this and does so because it honors Him and is beneficial to ourselves and to others. Beginning this month, I would like to explain each of those desires with you in a bit more detail. This month our subject is the need for the involvement of our members in our witness to God through service to the world.

I wish that you would get actively and deeply involved in the ministry of our congregation. On the cover of our bulletin each Sunday we list the goal of our congregation. We exist to follow Jesus Christ in a devoted manner and to help others to do the same. Our mission is his great commission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19, 20). The only way for us to accomplish this mission is for each of us to be actively and deeply involved in the ministry of our congregation.

Here's the reality of our situation: not only do most of our members not actively attend worship, even fewer participate in the activities, mission efforts, and leadership of our congregation.

There is, however, good news! God has given each of us gifts, talents, and abilities. Everyone has something to offer and a duty to use what God has given to strengthen our congregation and extend its outreach to our community and the world. This is why the Bible, when it talks about these gifts and abilities says that, "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good," (I Corinthians 12:7). You have something to offer! Your time and abilities are needed!

I'd like to encourage you to find one way to deepen your commitment to making devoted followers of Jesus through our congregation. You might do this by serving on a committee or participating in a special outreach event like feeding the homeless or going on a summer mission trip or by teaching Sunday school or helping with Vacation Bible School, or....well, you get the idea! If you would like specific ideas of how to be more involved I'd be glad to talk with you as would Elder Marcia Regan, who is the Chair of our Membership Development Committee.

That's it for this month. Let's get busy!

Presbyterian Women of Lake Erie Presbytery Spring Gathering – Saturday April 22nd 9:30-1:30 Meadville First Presbyterian Church "Who is My Neighbor?"

"And Why Do They Dress, Think, and Act in Ways That Might Make Me Worried About Them Moving into the Neighborhood?"

"And who is my neighbor?" "He said, 'The one who showed him mercy'. Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.'" Luke 10:29, 37







Explore the topic of "Who is My Neighbor" with <u>Keynote speaker- Rev. Tim Solomon</u>. Tim will help us to understand the basic tenets of Islam and learn more about our Muslim neighbors. He will particularly focus on Muslim women, including discussion on special clothing that they may wear (the hijab or al-khimar).

Rev. Solomon is Pastor of Emmanuel Church and part time interim pastor of Presbyterian Church of the Redeemer. Both of these churches are in Meadville, where for the past 23 years Tim has lived with his family. Tim is the product of Presbyterian mission efforts in Syria in the late 1800's! He has a bachelor's degree from Allegheny College in Mid-Eastern Studies, his M.Div from Princeton Seminary and his D.Min from Hartford Seminary's Macdonald School of Islamic Studies and Christian/Muslim Relations. He has taught classes about Muslims and their faith at Allegheny, Behrend and Pitt-Titusville.

In addition, we will enjoy the <u>wonderful music of Rev. Joel DiAngi</u>. Joel is a pastor of Christian Assembly Church in Greenville. He is an extremely talented pianist and is fluent in both Italian and modern-day Hebrew. He often travels throughout the US, Canada and Italy to bring God's Word to those hungry to hear him.

CLERK'S CORNER

Greetings to my church family!

Here are some updates from Session:

The biggest news is that our congregation will be moving back to **one worship service** on Sundays starting June 4, 2017. The time is yet to be determined. The format will be what is known as a "blended" service, as it will have both traditional and contemporary music. One reason Session decided to have one service is because it is difficult for members to stay in touch with each other if they attend different services. Another reason is that having just one service will reduce the struggles incurred with not having enough volunteer help, particularly for the audio/visual sound team. With the combination of services, Kirk Kids will be eliminated and children will be encouraged to stay with their parents during the worship hour.

Another change is Pastor Gregg will be starting a young couples/families group in our church. The group will get together for prayer, study and fellowship. This may entail the start of another Sunday School Class/Fellowship Group which Pastor Gregg will lead. The class will begin after Easter and extend until Pentecost and then begin again in the Fall. Activities will extend into the summer. The Membership Development committee will be polling the individuals and families to find out what their needs and wants are.

In addition to the group for young families, Pastor Gregg will be teaching two new classes this spring. The first is an adult theology class at 7:00 P.M. on Thursdays starting April 20 and continuing through June 8. This class will be based on C.S. Lewis's book *Mere Christianity* and a supplemental DVD. This is a very accessible book and the format is discussion oriented. It is expected this class will be highly interesting and fun! The required book is inexpensive. (Please speak with Pastor Gregg if purchasing a book prevents you from attending.)

The second class is an Old Testament Bible Study. It will meet each Wednesday at 10:00 A.M. beginning April 19 through June 7.

Session approved moving long-term funds of the church to Edward Jones (currently with Covenant and State Farm). Joellen Nelson will be our local fund manager. This came as the result of a recommendation from the Finance committee. It is anticipated that working with an active financial manager will result in higher and more consistent returns.

Looking way ahead, Session set the date for the 2018 annual meeting. It will be February 11, 2018. Prior to that, the election of officers will be November 19, 2017.

Here are two other dates for you to be aware of:

- April 8 Spring Fling Brunch hosted by the Fellowship committee
- April 14 Community Good Friday worship service at 12:00 P.M. Our church is hosting this year.
