Instead of New Year's Resolutions this year, I've decided to make three New Year's Wishes! Each of them is a wish for our congregation. Each of them is commanded of us by God and when followed, they free us and give us joy.

First, I wish that you would attend worship services with uncommon consistency. It should be a very rare Sunday morning that we do not find ourselves in church singing the praises of our Lord Jesus Christ, listening carefully to the preaching of God's Word, and praying for one another. *Here's the reality of our situation:* Most of our members' attendance on Sunday morning is the exception and not the rule. Hebrews 10:24-25 says, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, *not neglecting to meet together*, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." I hope that if you are a regular attender that you will also encourage and invite friends and family to attend worship with you. They're not likely to attend unless you ask them.

Second, I wish that you would get actively and deeply involved in the ministry of our congregation. *Here's the reality of our situation*: not only do most of our members not actively attend worship, even fewer participate in the activities, mission efforts, and leadership of our congregation. God has given each of us gifts, talents and abilities. Everyone has something to offer and a duty to use what God has given to strengthen our congregation and extend its outreach to our community and the world. This is why the Bible, when it talks about these gifts and abilities says that, "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (I Corinthians 12:7). You have something to offer! Your time and abilities are needed!

Third, I wish that everyone would make a generous financial commitment to our congregation. Every member should participate financially according to the Bible's instruction. God commands that we give 10% of our income. Malachi 3:10 says, "Bring the full tithe into the storehouse [the Temple]..." Jesus assumed that his followers would tithe. The practice of some members of the earliest church was actually to hold all of their wealth in common! (That verse from Acts scares me a little!]

Here's the reality of our situation: The majority of our members make no financial pledge commitment at all. Of those that do give, the average amount is about 1% of their income. [The Presbyterian Church (USA) average is 2%]. *The typical member in our congregation gives considerably less than just 1% of their income.*

It's not a matter of how much you make. Cash is tight for everyone! Just be faithful. Yet we can all give just one dollar out of every ten we make. Should we do so, the doors will open for us to carry out some astonishing mission and caregiving activities in Jesus' name. Also, if you need help in planning your finances we will be offering Financial Peace University again this year.

I hope my wishes come true this year. Will you help make that happen?

As of this writing, Session has not yet passed a budget for 2017, but I expect a budget to be adopted within the first few days of February.

In other business, I'm excited to let you know of a neat opportunity coming up this summer. "Group Work Camp," a national Christian youth mission group that is coming to North East June 26-30, 2017. There are 455 youth attending from all over the United States, and they will be staying at the North East School. While the camp itself is full, there are many ways that our youth and congregation can get involved and support Group Workcamp: Here are a few suggestions:

- Form a Welcome Committee
- Help the group move in
- Deliver popsicles to work sites
- Provide cookies, watermelon, lemonade etc. at the end of their work day
- Give financial support (\$19,000 needs raised, all funds stay local)
- Pray for the safety of the workers and chaperones
- Pray that hearts are opened to Christ through this experience

If you know of someone who might benefit from this opportunity pick up an application available in the church office. All approved projects are free, and 99% of applications are approved. Possible projects might include:

- Porch/steps
- Skirting/underpinning
- Winterization
- Painting
- Wheelchair ramp

There is a bit of a time crunch to apply. While there is no firm deadline yet, applications are already being processed, and material lists are being formed. I expect the window on this opportunity to close within the next few weeks.

Finally, I'm pleased to report that Jane Livingston has agreed to take over the Bell Choir Director position until a permanent candidate is found. Our church is very blessed because of this development, as our beloved Bell Choir will continue to ring and bring glory to God!
