CLERK'S CORNER

Hello to my church family!

I have much to share!

First, I wish to share with you that all churches within our presbytery will soon be assigned a "Congregational Advocate." The Congregational Advocate model will replace the Triennial visits from the Committee on Ministry. This new model seeks to be a proactive approach to avoiding problems within congregations versus the Triennial visits which were more reactive in nature. It is expected that our Congregational Advocate will be named sometime this Fall.

Our Membership Development committee sent out a letter earlier this summer to absentee members inquiring about their membership intentions and desires. As a result of that letter, 77 people were removed from membership because they indicated they have moved, unable to attend worship, or there was no response.

Regarding the care for our building, this summer the brickwork began and is nearly finished. Old mortar and loose bricks were extracted and replaced. And, all of the brickwork has been sealed. In addition, there was also a drain downspout on the east side that has been repaired. Finally, the Education Wing is now secure with new locks and new security procedures. You can read more about this in the article from the Trustees found in this newsletter. The Trustees have been very busy coordinating these projects. When you see a Trustee, please extend a big thank you to them for all of their sweat equity.

One of the things the Session is considering is on-line giving. There is a program available through the Presbyterian Foundation that would enable people to give electronically via our website. The Session is studying the information, and expects to revisit the topic soon.

As you may know, for the past few years I have been taking classes through the Theological Seminary at Dubuque University. My coursework (for now) is complete. And now I have joyful news! On June 20, 2017, I was appointed Commissioned Lay Pastor to the First Presbyterian Church of Sugar Grove. It is a wonderfully warm and open-armed congregation located in Warren County. Their membership is about 50 folks, and about half come to worship our Lord each Sunday. It is a very humbling and intimidating opportunity to serve God in this capacity. Please pray for me.

As my studies were winding down, the Presbytery's committee that had oversight of me, asked me what I was going to give up in order to take on this new, huge responsibility in Sugar Grove. After prayer, I decided to step down from Session. At our June 26 Session meeting, I resigned from the board with a mix of thankfulness and nervousness.

I am thankful for the opportunity to serve our congregation as Clerk for the past four and a half years. The experience afforded me a broader view of our denomination. In fact, it was during my term as Clerk that I began to significantly hunger for God more than ever before in my life. It was also during this time that I received a postcard about coursework to become a Commissioned Lay Pastor. I looked into it, and the rest is history.

For now, it is my intention to continue serving you all as the office secretary and treasurer. For this, I am also thankful, because I get to see and speak with many of you during the week.

I am so happy to also inform you that Marcia Regan is the new Clerk of Session. Marcia will doubtlessly do an outstanding job.

In closing, I wish to encourage you, as a member of this congregation, to immerse yourself within the many leadership and service opportunities available through our church. Doing so is different from other types of volunteerism, because being steeped in the church develops one's relationship with the Lord, and transforms a tepid faith life into something so alive, so dear, and so paramount.

RALLY DAY AND SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES BEGIN SEPTEMBER 10 AT 9:15 A.M.!

It's that time of year again - new beginnings, fresh starts and another exciting year of opportunities with your church family. On Sunday, September 10 a new Sunday School year will begin at the First Presbyterian Church of North East. Classes will begin at 9:15 A.M. for children and adults of all ages. The theme this year is, "I am the light of the world, whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." John 8:12

SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS OFFERINGS

GODLY PLAY: AGE 4 & KINDERGARTEN

(Led by Beth Seymour, Becky Oyler and Billie Blosser)

Godly Play is a method of Christian education and spiritual direction for preschool and Kindergartenaged children. The goal of Godly Play is to teach children to become more fully aware of the mystery of God's presence in their lives. This Montessori approach to education will help your child learn the building blocks of faith through reenacting Bible stories and other play techniques while being open to others, to new ideas, and to the future in creative ways.

GRADES 1, 2 AND 3 (Lead by Judy Schenker and Kitty Hurlburt)

Grade 1 & 2 curriculum focuses on learning to read while exploring Bible stories and verses that children can understand and recall. Children learn that God wants our trust and obedience, which leads them to Jesus, their Savior. Gospel Light confidently guides the teaching of the Bible—pure and simple, in contemporary and creative ways that will lay God's Word as the foundation for your kids' lives.

GRADES 4, AND 5 (Lead by Al and Bev Walz)

The curriculum for this class is designed to use Bible stories and verses that the children understand and in addition, help them to develop meaningful relationships and an understanding of Jesus as our Savior. Students also discover what the Bible says about popularity, success, failure, friendship, rules and more. Kids develop Bible study skills, grow in Christian maturity and respond by serving Jesus in church and the community.

FAITH AND FELLOWSHIP CLASS: YOUTH GRADES 6 THROUGH 12

(Lead by Tom McClure and Steve Seymour)
