The North East Council of Churches "Community Christmas Boxes" is a long-standing ministry that provides many families with food during the Christmas season. Last year, over 150 families were cared for.

This year, FPCNE is the host church for this worthwhile outreach. It is a sizable effort with many hands needed. Here is how you can help:



- + **PRAY:** Pray that God would supply food, monetary donations and volunteers to serve, so that this project will bring glory to Him as we reach out and tangibly bear witness of Christ's love to those in need.
- + **VOLUNTEER:** Sign up to assemble cardboard boxes, gather products, pack food, make phone calls and/or deliver. (See specific schedule below.)
- + **DONATE APPLESAUCE:** Our congregation is asked to donate 200 jars of applesauce. As you are able, consider purchasing and dropping off applesauce to the church.
- + GIVE: Consider a financial gift to this project. Although area businesses do donate funds and products, the largest amount of contributions come from the churches within our community.
