## PASTOR'S PEN

Jesus said, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." (Matthew 9:37).

Over the past decade, I've prayed regularly (well, just about every day) for increased spiritual vitality and depth in our congregation's walk with God. God has set us in this place at this time to make devoted followers of Jesus. This can seem like such an arduous task. We are tempted to think of all that we don't have that we think we don't have all we need to complete our mission. After all, when hasn't the congregation said that it needs more time, more money, and more people? If we are not careful, we can become paralyzed by the thoughts of just how big the field is and how feeble and few we are. What difference can we make, we wonder?

Jesus, however, looked at the situation in the exact opposite way! Doesn't he always do this? To begin with, he saw the great needs around him as a "harvest" ready to be taken in. He didn't look at the world as if it were an empty lot covered with rocks, trash, and weeds. He saw a harvest just waiting to be gathered. The crops are there for the taking! Jesus' view of our task is completely optimistic. It is not an impossible challenge, but a great opportunity that is set before us.

The number there are of us and the amount of our resources matter little. When Jesus spoke the words of Matthew 9:37 he was talking to twelve very ordinary men, one of whom would later betray him. If Jesus could work with them, then he can certainly work with us!

The fact of the matter is that our congregation is doing a great deal of harvesting; we have been for over two hundred years now. Rather than lament any supposed defeats or worry about any possible obstacles, what would happen if we focused on the many ways that God is using us as instruments for his glory, channels of his grace, and witnesses who keep pointing others to Jesus?

Here are just a few of the ways I've been watching the harvest come in: We are giving gently used and new clothing to care for disadvantaged families. (Boy, are we ever giving! The room is overflowing!) We contributed backpacks filled with clothes and essentials for the children of our community. In late September we will participate in the Crop Walk which feeds the hungry. We will box up presents again during Advent to bring Christmas cheer to dozens of children in a developing nation. We make cherry pies by the thousands and this year our amazing Presbyterian Women used some of that money to send youth to a Christian summer camp. This winter we will make and serve meals to the homeless yet again. Next summer we will hopefully send another mission team to West Virginia to help build essential housing for those in serious need. Each Sunday the Word of God is preached and taught. The sacraments are regularly administered. We sing and ring praises to our Lord each Sunday led by remarkably talented musicians and singers. The homebound and sick and grieving are visited and cared for. Transient men and women are cared for and sometimes housed for a night or two. Those who are discouraged and depressed are encouraged (this has been a big part of my pastoral care over the past few years). We are openly talking about our financial giving and becoming a more generous and financially faithful congregation. Not only did we give \$35,000 during the Erie Gives day but our giving patterns are slowly changing as a congregation and some among us actually take seriously God's command that we joyfully give a tenth of our earnings.

I don't know for sure what you think when you read the above list, and perhaps you're one of those folks who likes to dwell on what isn't happening or isn't happening well enough to meet your standards. As for me, well, it all sounds to me like we are bringing in an abundant harvest. We are experiencing an answer to our prayers: increased spiritual vitality and depth in our congregation's walk with God. We are making disciples. Thanks be to God.
